Since enrolling at Faison two years ago, Hatch has experienced something our family once wondered if we would ever see: for the first time, he LOVES going to school. Each morning, he eagerly looks forward to his day, excited to see the teachers and staff who know him, understand him, and celebrate him for exactly who he is. School is no longer a place of anxiety or uncertainty. It has become a place of peace and joy.

For the first time, Hatch has a school where he feels truly safe. Safe to learn. Safe to grow. Safe to make mistakes and try again. Surrounded by educators who recognize his strengths and provide the individualized support he needs, he has found an environment where he is thriving.

Perhaps most importantly, this is the first time Hatch has consistently been treated with the kindness, patience, and respect every child deserves. At Faison, he is welcomed with smiles, encouraged through challenges, and celebrated for every accomplishment—big and small. Those daily moments of compassion have helped him build confidence, trust, and a genuine love of learning.

The results have been extraordinary. In just two years at Faison, Hatch has made more academic, social, behavioral, communication and personal progress than he did throughout his entire educational journey before coming here. Milestones that once felt out of reach have become reality because he is learning in an environment designed to help him succeed.

To many, these may seem like ordinary moments. To Hatch and our family, they are life-changing. They represent a future filled with hope instead of worry, possibility instead of limitation, and belonging instead of isolation.

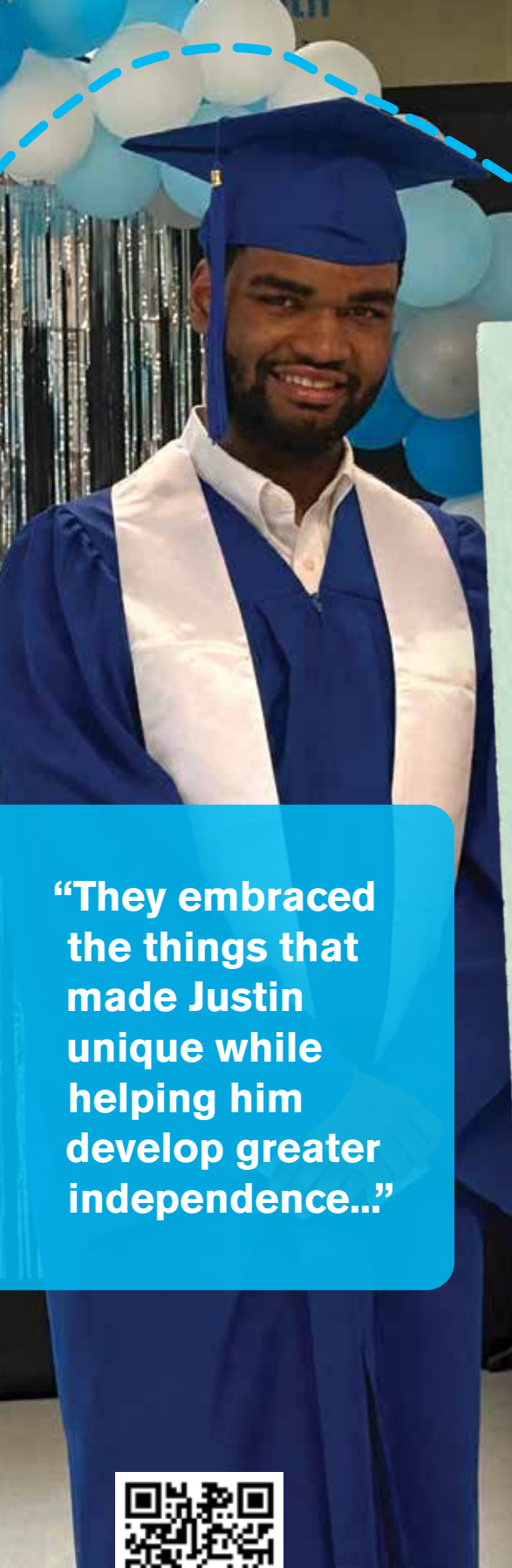


...on Hatch's development and well-being. We have watched him gain confidence, build relationships, and experience joy in ways that might not have been possible without the support of people like you.

My name is David Dawson, and my son, Justin, has been a part of the Peninsula School at The Faison Center since he was around 10 years old. This year, our family had the incredible privilege of watching Justin graduate—a milestone that represents far more than the completion of school. For us, it represents years of growth, perseverance, love, and the unwavering support of people who believed in him.

Justin's journey has not always been easy. There were days when he would have preferred to stay home and lie down rather than face the challenges ahead. But throughout the years, the staff at Faison continued to meet Justin exactly where he was while encouraging him to take one more step forward.

Over the years, we watched Justin grow from a child into a young adult. Faison became more than a school to our family. It became a place where he was understood, accepted, challenged, encouraged, and celebrated for exactly who he is.

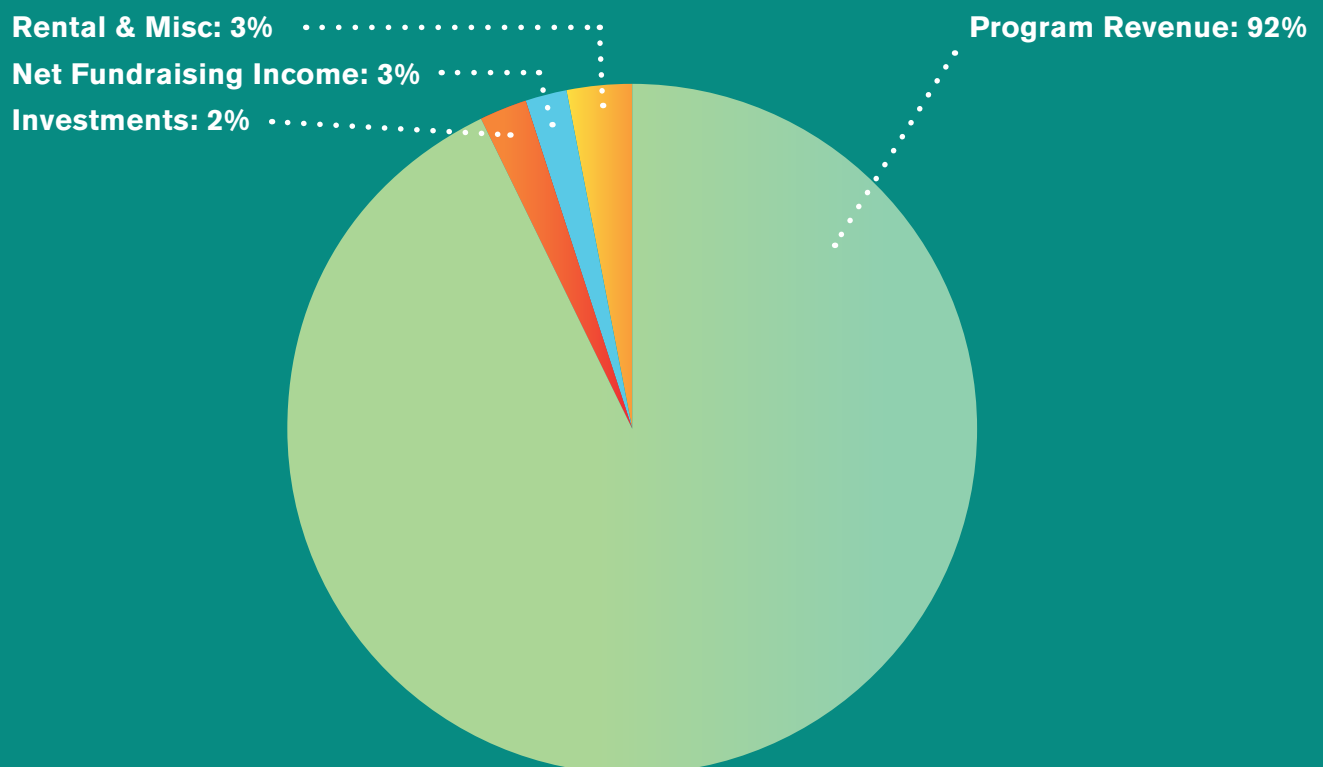
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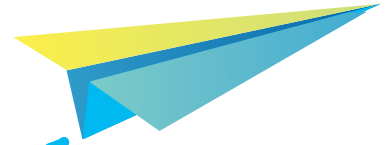
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Income by Source



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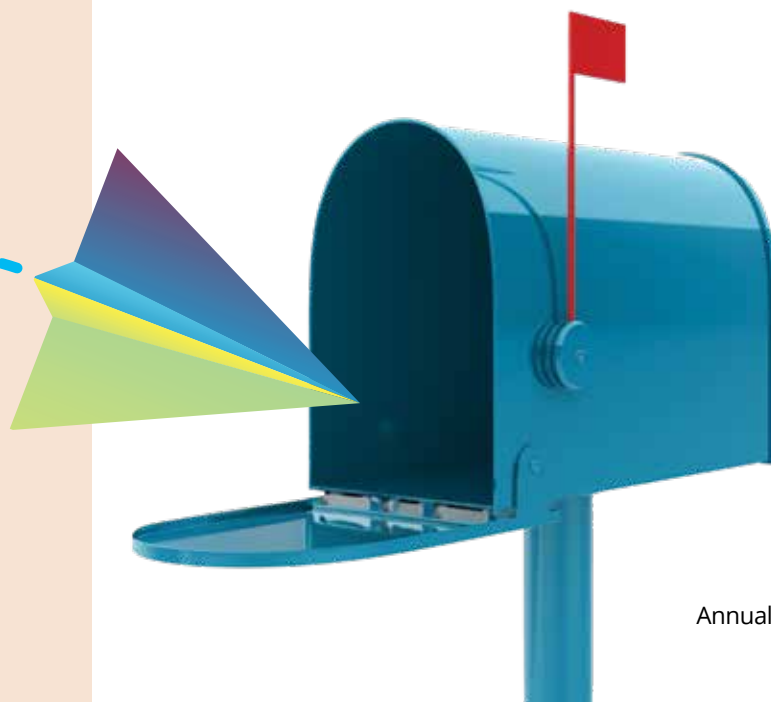
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Our Mission
